February 4, 2002

A couple of items: First, I said at the end of the last newsletter that I would pass on the size of the attendance at the Science Knowledge Bowl this past weekend. Here it is – there were 60 teams and 30 schools, which translates into about 400 students. This is down from previous years, but considering the ice storm we had the several days before, that's not bad. There were more than 300K customers blacked out in KCMO alone, plus more in surrounding territories.
