Linking Technology Implemented for Library Databases and Periodical Collection.

Rockhurst University Greenlease Library uses the service *Article Linker* by Serials Solutions to link from selected library databases to electronic copies of periodical titles (magazines, journals and newspapers) owned by the library. Article Linker works within most of the databases to which the library subscribes, but not all. If you do not see a link to full text at Rockhurst University's library in a database, this means that the database cannot work with Article Linker at this time.

The library has established a new *Electronic Periodicals Holdings List* to link our users to the full text of any journal, newspaper or magazine to which the library subscribes in an electronic format. Currently, the library subscribes to over 14,000 titles electronically. Some titles have their most recent issues embargoed, meaning that a period of time set by the publisher of the title must elapse before the publisher will release the issues electronically. In addition, the library also subscribes to over 500 titles in print. To find these print titles use the *Periodical Holdings Catalog* on the "Periodical Holdings" page listed above. Eventually both electronic and print titles will be listed in one catalog.

Reading:

Deception Point by Dan Brown is thrilling fiction about a political conspiracy involving Washingtonian key players and a shocking scientific discovery buried deep in the Arctic ice.

Naked in Cyberspace: How to find personal information online by Carole A. Lane includes chapters such as The Internet, consumer online systems and personal information, a word about privacy, bank records, prospect researching (fundraising) and recruitment and job searching.

Stiff, the curious lives of human cadavers by Mary Roach is a fascinating and humorous look at how cadavers donated to science have improved the life of the living. If you like forensic science novels by Kathy Reichs or Patricia Cornwell you'll be able to read this without flinching.

For those people who like their mystery series with a slight horror twist, I recommend Charlene Harris. Her heroine, Sookie Stackhouse, spunky psychic barmaid, lives in Bon Temps, Louisiana. What's a poor mind-reading barmaid to do when she gets mixed up with vampires, werewolves, shifters, witches, and other supernatural oddities? The series is now up to four books, Dead Until Dark, Living Dead in Dallas, Club Dead, & Dead to the World. Not scary, but fast paced, and often amusing commentary with a Southern sensibility, populated with interesting characters, vampire politics and good plot lines.

New member library in the WILO Cluster of MOBIUS

This semester the Kansas City Art Institute joined in as the newest member of the WILO cluster of the MOBIUS consortium. The book collection of this library is now available through the WILO online catalog <http://wilo.missouri.edu/search-SO> and selected books can be borrowed online through the catalog. The WILO (Western Interlibrary Organization) cluster now consists of Rockhurst University, Avila University, Metropolitan

Community College (Blue River, Longview, Maple Woods, Penn Valley), Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Saint Paul School of Theology, William Jewell College and the Kansas City Art Institute. For the fiscal year beginning in June 2004 through February 2005 the Rockhurst University

Greenlease Library has loaned over 500 books to other libraries in the MOBIUS consortium and borrowed over 800 books from those libraries. The larger MOBIUS consortium consists of almost 60 college and university libraries in the state of Missouri and 2 public library systems that are cooperating partners. More information about

Focus On a Resource

The RefWorks bibliographic management software is a powerful tool to keep track of research sources. Citations can be exported directly from a database, for example, an EBSCOhost database, and then imported into RefWorks. From there, select from a wide variety of standard as well as specific journal citation styles to create a bibliography for a paper or manuscript.

In-text citations can be in-

serted into a document using the Write N' Cite or Cite/View features. To download the Write N' Cite plug-in application you must use a personal computer. Currently, Write N' Cite cannot be downloaded on network computers within the computer labs. Cite/View can be used on network computers.
