Be Prepared for November!

Do you have questions about the upcoming presidential election? Are you wondering if you are registered, or where to vote? Perhaps you have questions about the presidential candidates, or about local issues.

The Greenlease Library has provided students with an [Election and Voting Resource Guide](#), which provides nonpartisan information on the candidates and elected offices, political parties, propositions and registering and voting for the November 4, 2008 General Election.

Since there are elections on local, state and federal levels, a wide variety of materials exist. In the past few years many of the resources have been made electronically through websites, but a vast amount of fiction and non-fiction related to elections and voting is still being published in print.

In the past several years

the book publishing industry has significantly increased the number of books published on political figures. Since this publishing niche has grown so quickly it is hard for any individual library to keep up with adding these to their collection. Be sure to check other

MOBIUS libraries if the Greenlease Library does not have the latest book on a candidate that you are needing.

of the library, even for a few minutes, or if you leave the building entirely, please remember to take your personal belongings with you.

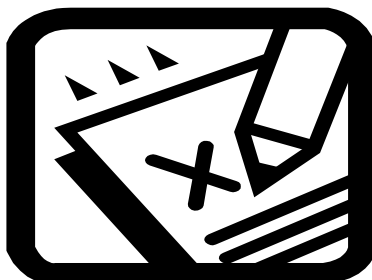


Be Prepared for November! (cont'd)

Some are used primarily for academic research, while others can be used to find popular articles to practice one's reading skills. Some are available only in print, while others will be electronic and may even contain the full-text of the article.

Finally, the guide provides a list of internet resources that ad-

dress questions related to elections and voting and websites that answer them. Whether you are voting in this state or a surrounding one, you will have information about state and local elections at your fingertips.
